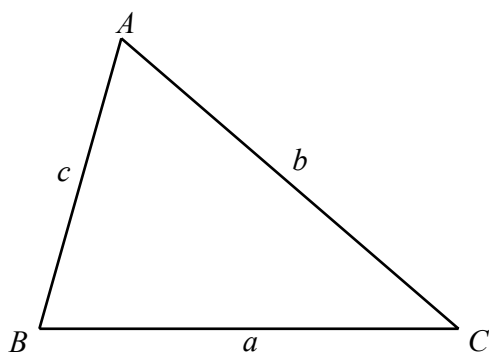

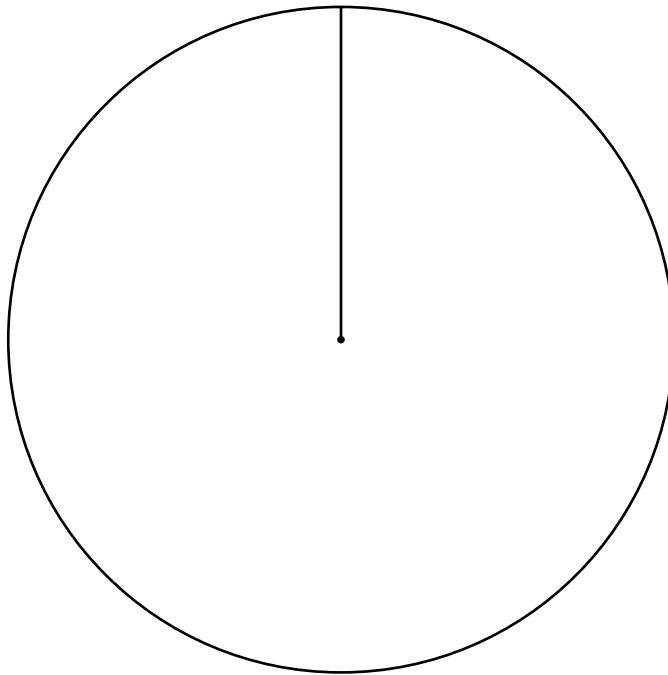

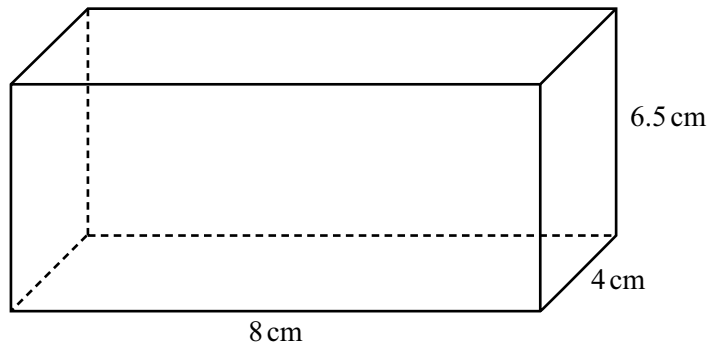

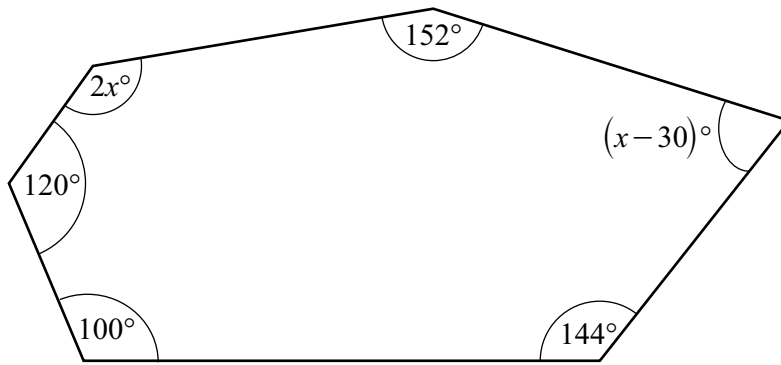

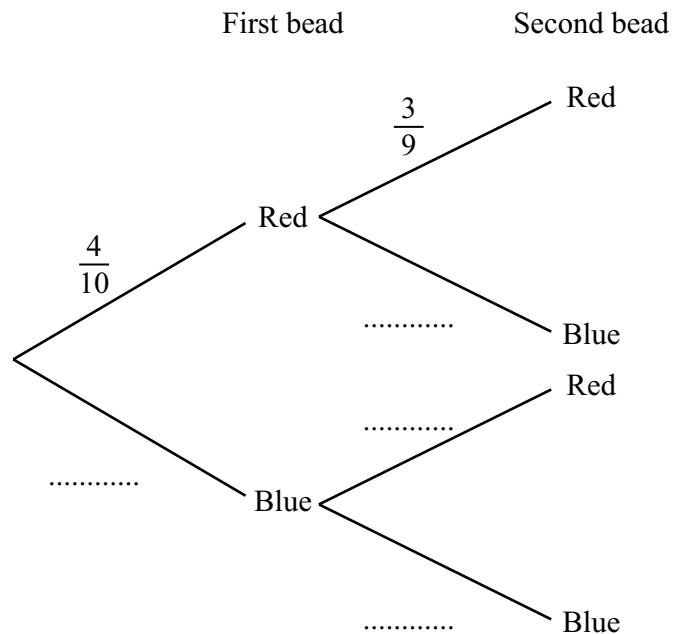

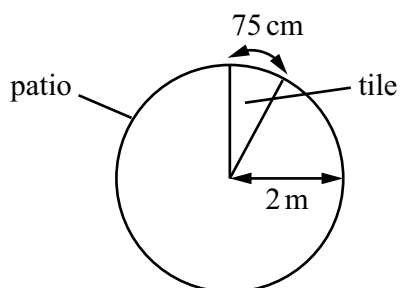

Each tile is a sector with arc length 75 cm.



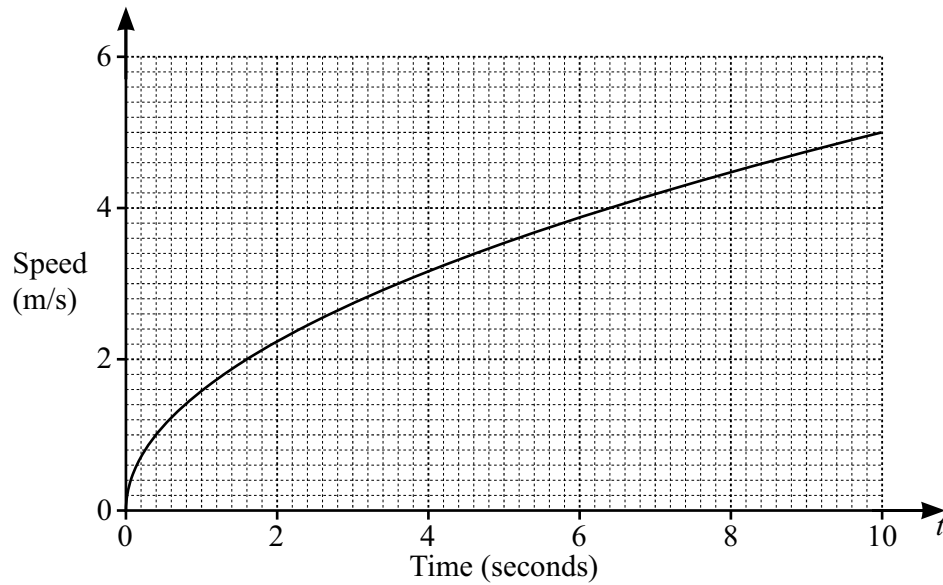
Explain why the tiles do **not** fit exactly on the surface of the patio.

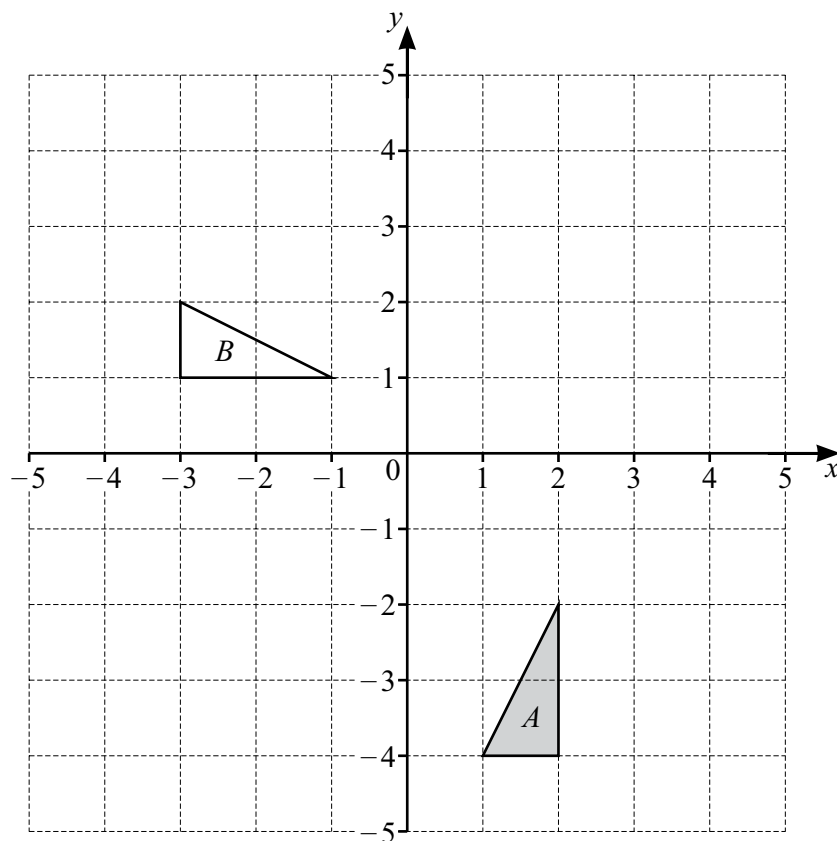
- 14 The table shows the distances travelled by 80 people to a shopping mall.

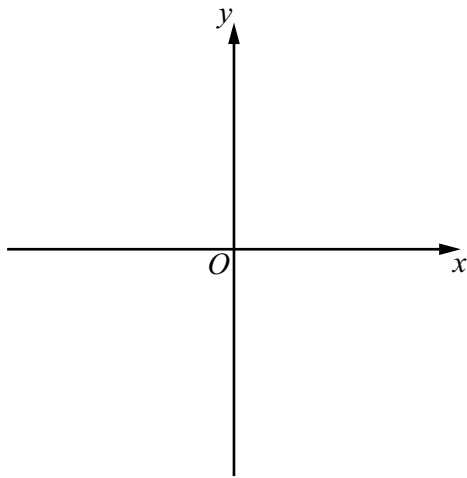

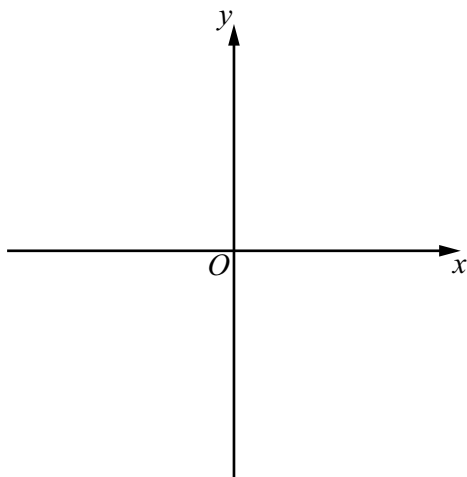

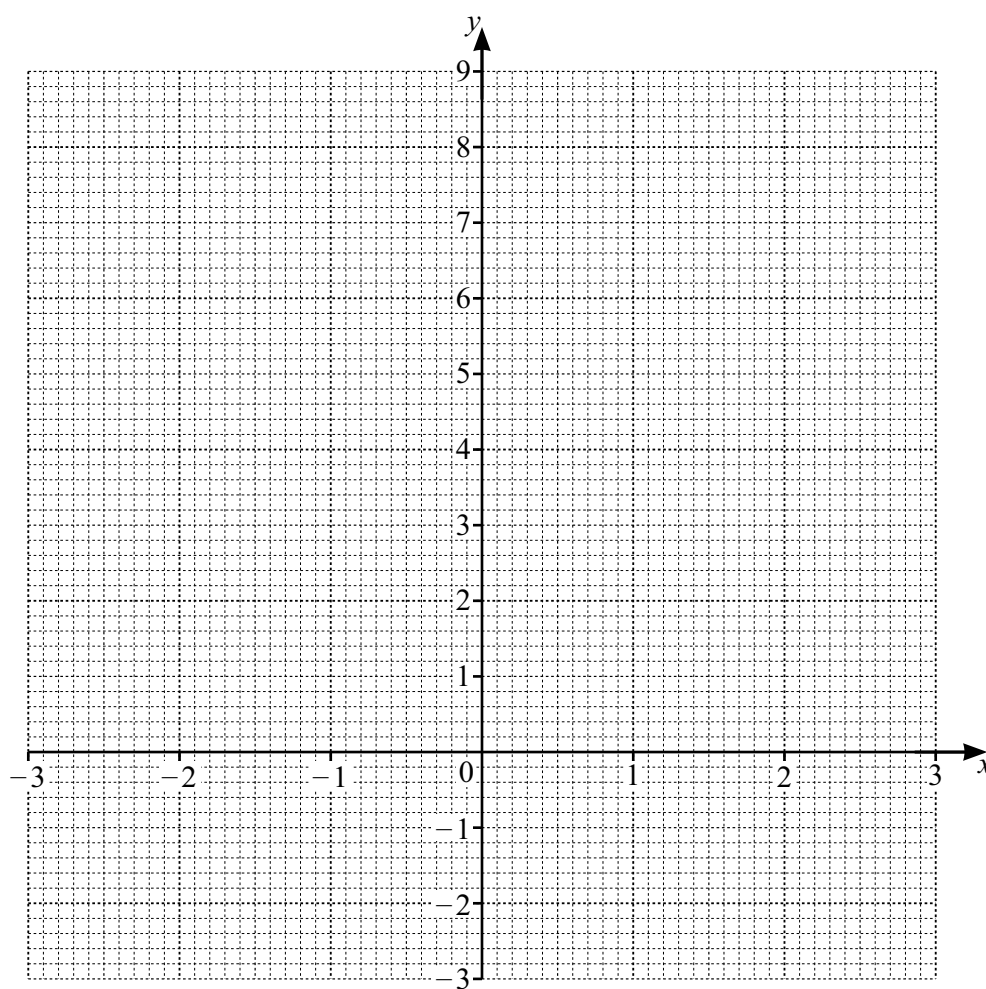

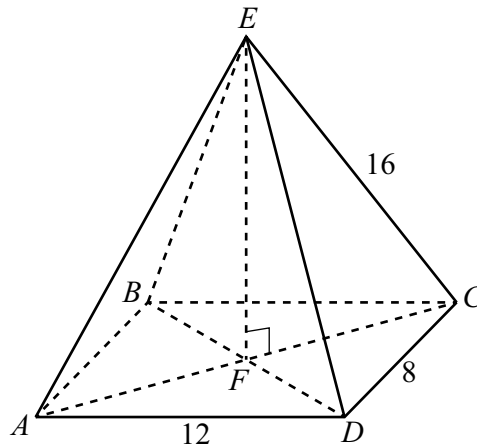

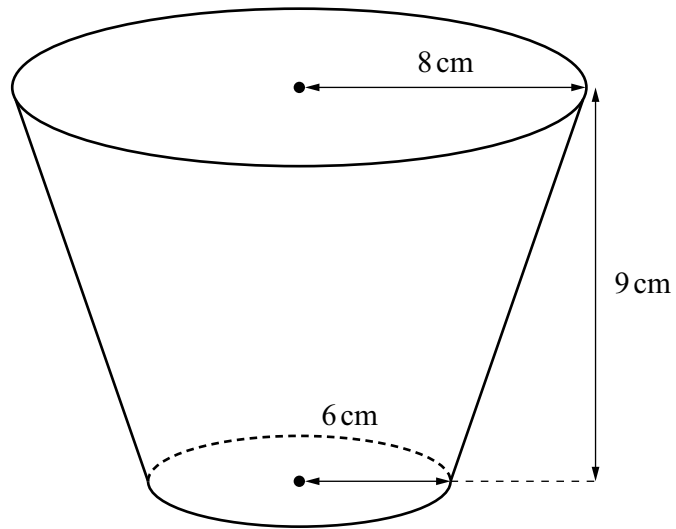
